



Restorative Aide

Meets Tuesdays/Thursdays 8 am – 1:30pm

This 85-hour course presents rehabilitation concepts and techniques to be used in healthcare settings. The restorative aide will learn to provide care according to the care plan and under the direction of the Registered Nurse and/or Physical Therapist. Competencies include restorative care for residents with neurovascular diseases, transfers, body mechanics, and use of assistive devices and prosthetics. Must have the 75 hour nurse aide course prior to entering this course. It is also recommended the applicant have at least 6 months experience as a nurse aide and a written recommendation from the nursing director or administrator. This course has 65 hours of class and lab and a 20-hour job shadow component.

Objectives:

- Understand the general concepts of a Rehabilitation/Restorative Aide.
- Identify and demonstrate the use of various types of rehabilitative equipment
- Demonstrate documentation of resident care and progress.
- Demonstrate mobility techniques for residents
- Discuss care for residents with special needs

Class Schedule: includes classroom & lab. Clinical experience will be coordinated with a rehabilitative facility
