

IVCCD Common Learning Objectives

1. Students who demonstrate “acquiring knowledge, comprehension and thinking critically” will
 - a. Identify, describe, define and list knowledge.
 - b. Explain, classify and relate knowledge to demonstrate comprehension.
 - c. Apply knowledge to demonstrate, calculate, and interpret a process to create a product or perform a task.
 - d. Evaluate, Interpret and critique the aesthetic richness that has contributed to human life.

2. Students who demonstrate “solving problems” will
 - a. Interpret information and manipulate it to represent or model a problem.
 - b. Apply knowledge and experience to reason deductively.
 - c. Apply knowledge and experience reason inductively.
 - d. Develop reasoned and thorough arguments to produce and evaluate conclusions.

3. Students who demonstrate “oral, written and visual communications” will
 - a. Interpret, evaluate and critique multimodal communications.
 - b. Use grammatically, stylistically and syntactically correct and appropriate language.
 - c. Create effective products appropriate to the audience and purpose.

4. Students who demonstrate “technology and information literacy” will
 - a. Demonstrate competence with computer and technological applications appropriate to the field of study or occupation chosen.
 - b. Utilize and apply information technology responsibly and appropriately.
 - c. Utilize and synthesize information to make reasoned responses.

5. Students who demonstrate “good citizenship” will
 - a. Demonstrate personal and professional leadership skills.
 - b. Articulate and practice expectations and obligations of local, national and global citizenship.
 - c. Identify and employ ethical and moral considerations in decision making processes.
 - d. Acknowledge and value each person and all cultures.
 - e. Contributes to community through service.
