
Scholarship Requirements


- Students must apply for the MEP program prior to the end of their first semester at MHS
- Students must be a firstgeneration college student (neither parent has a bachelor's degree or higher)
- Students must demonstrate financial need
- Students must maintain a GPA of 2.75 or be ranked in the top 50% of their MHS class
- Students must maintain 95% attendance at MHS


MEP Goals

- MEP students attending MCC will complete either a certificate or/and an associate's degree.
