Protocol for Students Testing Positive or Direct Exposure to COVID-19

Effective January 6, 2022, student protocols for <u>isolation and quarantine</u> have been updated based on <u>changes</u> issued by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Note: The following may be subject to change based on updated guidance and regulations.

Students who test positive for COVID-19 (Isolate):

- Do not come to campus or attend classes.
- Immediately notify the College by completing the COVID-19 student reporting form https://www.iavalley.edu/covid-student-reporting/. In addition, housing students should contact a Residence Life staff person immediately for isolation housing.
- Isolate at home for at least five days (Day 1 is the first full day after your symptoms developed). After five full days:
 - If you still have symptoms and a fever, continue to stay home until your fever resolves (i.e., 24-hours fever-free).
 - If your symptoms have improved and you are fever-free, you can leave your house.
 - Continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.
- At the College's discretion, you may need to provide a release from your health care provider before returning to campus/classes

Students who were exposed to someone with COVID-19 (Quarantine):

- Do not come to campus or attend classes, unless you fit Scenario 1 (see table below).
- Immediately notify the College by completing the COVID-19 student reporting form <u>https://www.iavalley.edu/covid-student-reporting/</u>. Housing students should contact a Residence Life staff person immediately for quarantine housing.

Scenario 1 (<u>No</u> symptoms)	If you are <u>up-to-date</u> with your COVID- 19 vaccination, which means you: Have been boosted OR Completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine within the last 6 months OR Completed the primary series of J&J vaccine within the last 2 months	 If you are up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccination, you may be on-campus. Wear a mask around others for 10 days. Test on day 5, if possible. If you develop symptoms get tested and stay home.
-------------------------------------	---	--

Scenario 2 (<u>No</u> symptoms)	If you are NOT up-to-date with your COVID-19 vaccination, which means you: Completed the primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine over 6 months ago and are <u>not</u> boosted OR Completed the primary series of J&J over 2 months ago and are <u>not</u> boosted OR Are <u>unvaccinated</u>	 Stay home for 5 days. After that continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days. If you can't quarantine you must wear a mask for 10 days. Note: IVCCD is requiring students to stay home for the first 5 days. Test on Day 5 if possible If you develop symptoms get a test and stay home.
Scenario 3 (symptoms present)	Regardless of vaccination status: If you have or develop symptoms, get a test and stay home.	 Follow process above, "Students who test positive for COVID-19 (Isolate)" End isolation after 5 full days if you are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and your symptoms are improving. Continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days.

• At the College's discretion, you may need to provide a release from your health care provider before returning to campus/classes.

We encourage students to get vaccinated, wear a mask and stay at home when you are sick. If you are not vaccinated, contact your local health provider or search <u>Vaccines.gov</u> for vaccine availability.
